

Lycée Gustave Eiffel, Rueil-Malmaison

In 1995, the town of Rueil-Malmaison, near the Château of Malmaison, launched a competition for the renovation of its high school.

The competition team Atelier Girot and the architects Hubert & Roy proposed a design that handled the large elevation difference between street and school yard level to the students' advantage. The landscaped slopes become sitting areas among

exotic trees and an extensive hedge of hibiscus. The street level entrance courtyard offers a semi private piazza. Standing benches separate the students from the street and provide a leaning structure. Vertical gardens flank the classrooms with wisteria creating a green facade.

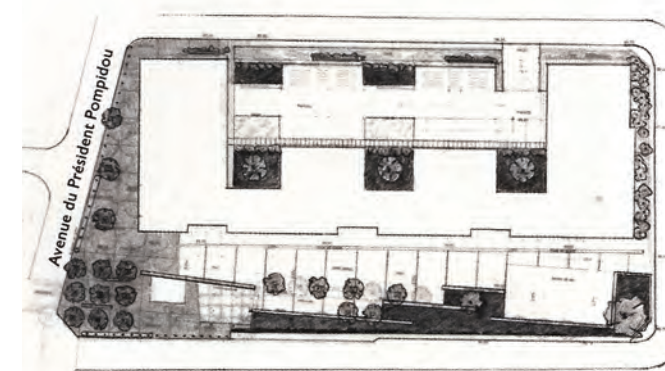

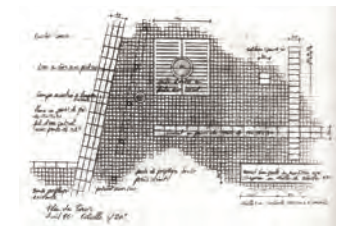
