## The New Institute, Hamburg

The New Institute Garden is a long and narrow space (80 meters long and 17 meters wide). On the western side, the garden is flanked by the historic facades of the Warburg Ensemble. On the eastern side is the 40 meter high wall of the socalled British American Tobacco Building. Garden design

To convey unity and spaciousness, the garden is treated as an open large rectangular lawn. The trees and plantings are located along the edges of this large space. The function of the garden is to

shelter from neighboring views and to provide various viewing points from the interior levels of the institute. The garden ends at the northern edge, with the sunniest area, is designed as a vegetable and flower garden. The wall thus becomes part of the garden design.

The Bridge. The design of The Bridge, as a steel frame, truss and canopy, is intended to be very minimal and able to adapt to various configurations.

structure, The Bridge, and could be dismantled and repositioned elsewhere in the structure as needed. The stairs and building elements are designed so that they can be reconfigured when removed if necessary.


